Your child may benefit from early intervention

if...

Your child might benefit from early intervention if he or she is **under three years old** and **has shown delays** in any of the following developmental areas:

- **Talking** (language/communication)
- Sitting, walking (gross motor)
- Reaching, using hands (fine motor)
- Feeding, dressing (self-help)
- Expressing feelings, relating to others, behavior (personal/social)
- Learning, thinking (cognition)



Early Intervention is designed to help infants and toddlers improve their developmental skills.

Early Intervention is family-centered. Parents play a primary role in identifying and working towards the goals they would like their child to reach.

Early skill development advances future learning and independence.

- Occupational, Physical & Speech Therapy
- Individual Feeding Therapy
- Feeding Group Therapy
- Sensory-Motor Groups
- Developmental Assessments

Family Support/Resources

- Individual guidance is provided to assist parents in more effective parenting techniques.
